



<p><b>Science</b>  <b>Animals including Humans Amazing Me!</b>  Children learn that humans are a type of animal, known as a mammal. They name body parts and recognise common structures between humans and other animals. They learn about the senses, the body parts associated with each sense and their role in keeping us safe.</p>	<p><b>Mathematics</b>  Sequence, place value, addition and subtraction and counting on in twos, fives and tens. <p><b>Autumn Term 1 Theme - Childhood</b></p>  <p>In the Childhood theme, your child will learn words and phrases related to the passage of time. They will explore artefacts to help them to understand childhood in the past and how childhood has changed over time. They will explore the six stages of life and explore timelines and family trees. Everyday life in the 1950s will be explored, including shopping, transport, family life and childhood. They will also learn about the significance of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation in 1953 by studying photographs and online sources. The children will use maps to explore how places have changed over time and highlight any similarities or differences between childhood today and childhood in the 1950s. At the end of the theme, they will create knowledge organisers. <b>Trips for this theme: Legoland</b></p>

They will also learn about health and well-being linked to Islam. They will name and describe shelters as well as design and make shelter prototypes.  They will then design and build a play den as a group and evaluate their completed product.</p>
