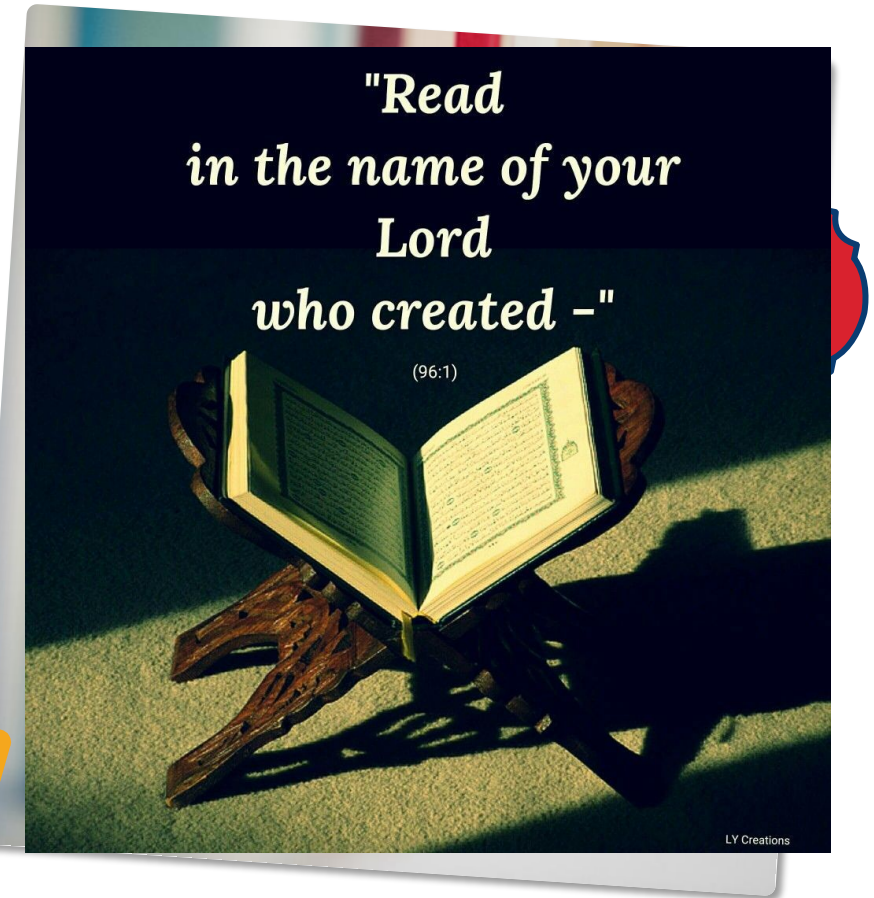

Letter Formation

The grip is the same for both left- and right-handed children.

Phonics

Grammar 1
for children aged 5-6
