



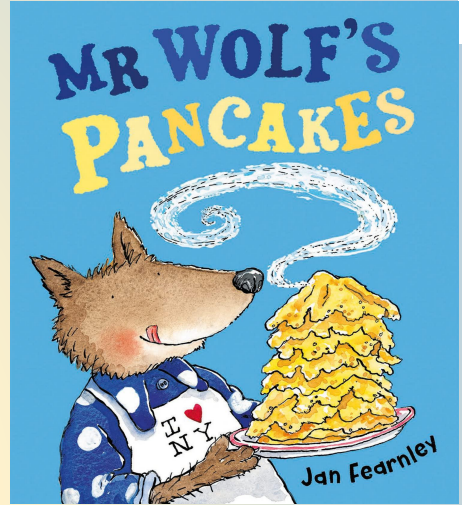
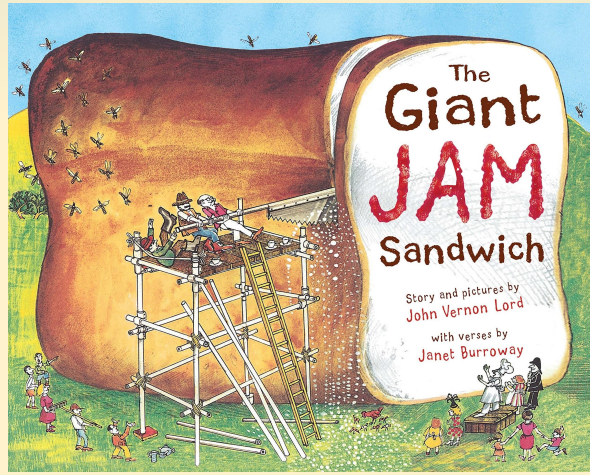
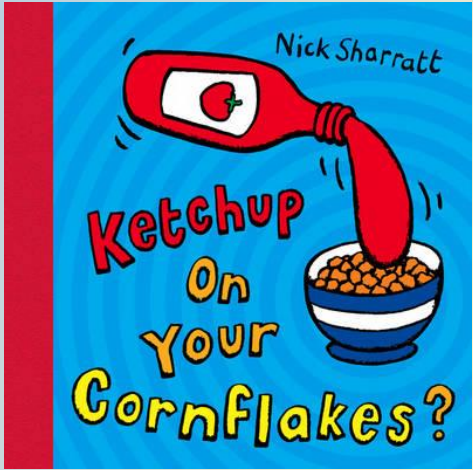
# Early Years Foundation Stage – Reception Class

## Summer Term 1 – Animal Safari and Creep, Crawl and Wriggle

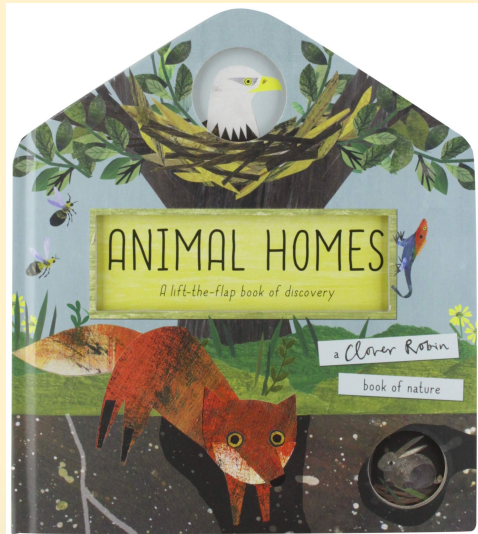
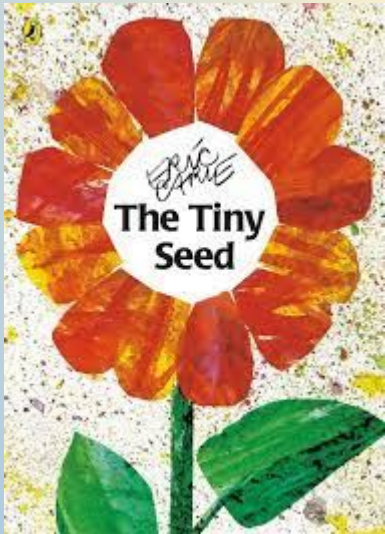

<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Know and talk about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing: - regular physical activity - healthy eating - toothbrushing - sensible amounts of 'screen time' - having a good sleep routine - being a safe pedestrian</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Think about the perspectives of others.</li> <li>Learn to look after minibeasts and speak about the importance of respecting Allah's creation.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and making use of conjunctions, with modelling and support from their teacher.</li> <li>Make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding.</li> <li>Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role-play.</li> <li>Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.</li> </ul> <p><b>Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show an understanding of the meanings of new words by using them in discussion and role play situations.</li> <li>Offer explanations for why things happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction, rhymes, and poems when appropriate.</li> <li>Learn new vocabulary and social phrases and use them throughout the day in small group discussions and during play activities.</li> </ul> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p>	<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use their core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor.</li> <li>Combine different movements with ease and fluency.</li> <li>Further develop and refine a range of ball skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming.</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children will identify stages in the lifecycle of a seed and animals and be able to name the different parts of common plants.</li> <li>Children will develop their writing skills and write their own instructions to plant their own seeds.</li> <li>Retell stories and narratives through role play and small world play, using some key vocabulary.</li> <li>Talk about the characters, events and settings in stories they have listened to, using props and materials for role play.</li> <li>Write sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences using a capital letter and full stop.</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Engage in conversations, learning new vocabulary. Use longer sentences of four to six words. Develop phonological awareness. Write some letters accurately.</li> <li>Learn and use new vocabulary. Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important. Articulate ideas in well-formed sentences. Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding. Engage with and talk about non-fiction books.</li> <li>Read phrases and sentences independently. Re-read books to build up confidence.</li> <li>Use adjectives and connectives in writing to describe settings and characters.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Automatically recall (without reference to rhymes, counting or other aids) number bonds up to 5 (including subtraction facts) and number bonds to 10.</li> <li>Understand number compositions up till 20 and have a deep knowledge of teen numbers.</li> <li>Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system.</li> <li>Explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, including evens and odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally.</li> <li>Telling the time using an analog clock. (o'clock)</li> <li>Continue, copy and create repeating patterns using a variety of objects.</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, including evens and odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally.</li> <li>Solve simple problems related to length, height, capacity, weight, time and money.</li> <li>Understand and use positional language in relation to place, direction and objects.</li> <li>Items can be measured using non standard units to show how long or tall they are.</li> <li>Understand and use positional language in relation to place, direction and objects.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop scientific knowledge through play activities. Sharing stories and non-fiction books and discussion.</li> <li>Plants and animals are living things. Plants need water, sunlight and air to survive. Animals need food water, air and shelter to survive.</li> <li>Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of plants and animals.</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter.</li> <li>Describe their immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.</li> <li>A habitat is a place where living things live. Living things, including plants and animals, live in the local environment.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Animal Safari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.</li> <li>Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others.</li> <li>Making simple prints using a variety of tools, including print blocks and rollers.</li> </ul> <p><b>Creep, Crawl and Wriggle</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Observe how activities are going and adapt their ideas if necessary.</li> <li>Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.</li> <li>Share their creations, explaining the process they have used.</li> </ul>



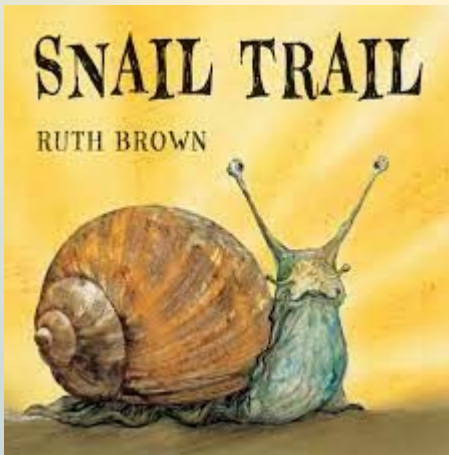
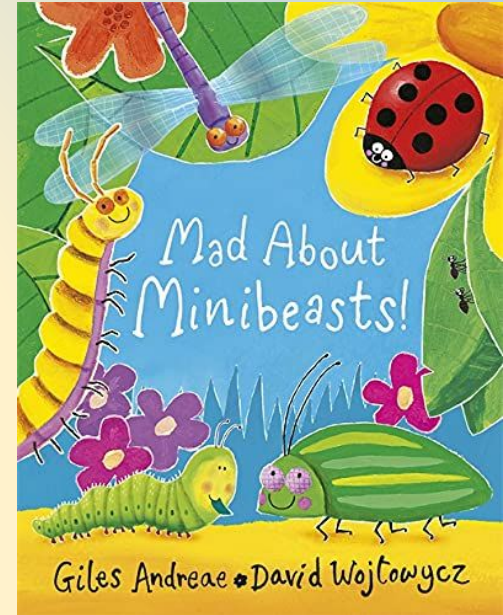

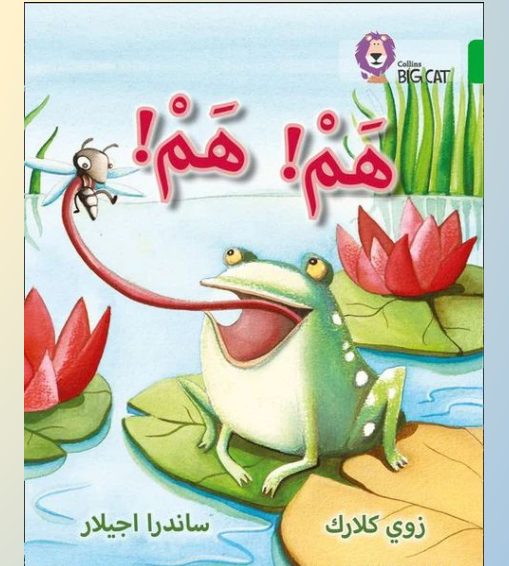
