





#### Spring Term 2: Dangerous Dinosaurs and Puddles and Rainbows

In the Dangerous Dinosaurs theme, your child will find out about prehistoric animals. They will learn facts about dinosaurs and discover how big some of these giant creatures were. They will learn about the difference between carnivores and herbivores. They will also find out about the animals that lived after the dinosaurs and which modern-day animals have prehistoric relatives.

<ul> <li>Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories and narratives using their own words and recently introduced vocabulary.</li> <li>Using the Pie Corbett Talk for Writing Scheme to ensure fluency and emphasis on newly introduced vocabulary.</li> <li>Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role-play.</li> <li>Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs.</li> <li>Jolly Phonics: Recap digraphs with vocabulary: ai, oa, ie, ee, or, ng Introduce sounds from set 3 and 4.</li> <li>Tricky Words: he, she, me, we, be</li> <li>Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending.</li> <li>Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Number: 2-3 year olds: Counting to 5 using fingers and objects.</li> <li>Number: 3-4 year olds: Counting beyond 10 and recognising numbers beyond 10.</li> <li>Use language in their play, including heavy, light, heavier, lighter, long, short, longer, shorter, tall, taller, full and empty.</li> <li>Explore length, height, weight and capacity in their play and begin to use language associated with this with support, such as long, short, tall, heavy, light, full and empty.</li> <li>Use money, including coins, in role play situations.</li> <li>Continue, copy and create repeating patterns using a variety of objects.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants.</li> <li>Understanding some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.</li> <li>Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and – when appropriate – try to move in time to rhythms.</li> </ul>






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
